CONFIRMATION 2024-2026

A new confirmation class will begin in September 2024. Traditionally, confirmation is extended to youth in 8th grade for a 1 year program. While this is the "way we've always done it", Pastor Tarrah recognizes that it is time for a "new way" to allow and encourage youth to engage their faith and denomination towards confirmation. This new confirmation program welcomes all youth beginning 5th grade for a 2 year program that will meet on the 1st and 3rd Sunday of each month immediately following worship. The first year of the program will dive into our treasured bible stories and build their biblical literacy. The second year of the program will expand to include confirmation curriculum to explore their beliefs, our denomination, and our local church. 
<u>"W.O.W." Retreat: September 17th – 19th, 2024</u>

Book Club



Our Book Club's new selection will be "Before We Were Yours" by Lisa Wingate. We will get together at Machete's in New Athens on Thursday, April 25th at 6 pm for our discussion.

"Memphis, 1939. Twelve-year-old Rill Foss and her four younger siblings live a magical life aboard their family's Mississippi River shantyboat. But when their father must rush their mother to the hospital one stormy night, Rill is left in charge—until strangers arrive in force. Wrenched from all that is familiar and thrown into a Tennessee Children's Home Society orphanage, the Foss

children are assured that they will soon be returned to their parents—but they quickly realize the dark truth. At the mercy of the facility's cruel director, Rill fights to keep her sisters and brother together in a world of danger and uncertainty.

Aiken, South Carolina, present day. Born into wealth and privilege, Avery Stafford seems to have it all: a successful career as a federal prosecutor, a handsome fiancé, and a lavish wedding on the horizon. But when Avery returns home to help her father weather a health crisis, a chance encounter leaves her with uncomfortable questions and compels her to take a journey through her family's long-hidden history, on a path that will ultimately lead either to devastation or to redemption.

Based on one of America's most notorious real-life scandals—in which Georgia Tann, director of a Memphis-based adoption organization, kidnapped and sold poor children to wealthy families all over the country—Lisa Wingate's riveting, wrenching, and ultimately uplifting tale reminds us how, even though the paths we take can lead to many places, the heart never forgets where we belong."

NEW HYMNALS

During our Annual Meeting this February, there was a desire mentioned, by some, for a return to hymnal singing. Pastor Tarrah has been researching the possibility of obtaining the same, new hymnals for both of our worship locations. Pew hymnals cost, on average, \$20-\$50 each. As you can imagine, a hefty price tag will accompany a purchase of this type. It's also reasonable to mention that our pews are in need of bibles as well. There are a couple of different ways for us to consider that we can go about meeting these goals for our worship locations.

Hymnals- The New Century Hymnal is the hymnal of the UCC. While there are many traditional songs in this hymnal edition, there are also many treasured hymns that aren't in this hymnal. And to be quite honest, there isn't a single hymnal that contains ALL of the hymns in one compilation. We can, however, create our own hymnal to reflect the worship style of our faith community. In order to complete a project as large as this, we will need volunteers to assist with the project. We will also need to compile a list of YOUR favorite hymns to ensure that we don't inadvertently leave any out. If you are interested in assisting creating our own hymnal, please let Pastor Tarrah know.

Bibles- The New Revised Standard Version translation of the Bible is the most accurate translation available. Pew bibles are available to be purchased in bulk to fit alongside our hymnals so people have an opportunity to engage in biblical literacy during our worship services. The cost of pew bibles in this translation ranges from \$10.99-\$12.99 each.

One of the ways that churches typically fund projects such as these (hymnals and bibles) is to have families or individuals purchase one or more in honor, memory, or celebration of a loved one or event. The dedication will then be printed and affixed inside the hymnal or bible in commemoration. If you are interested in being a part of a committee to explore and facilitate these projects, please let Pastor Tarrah know.

VISIONING COMMITTEE
