Facing Forward by Pastor Tarrah

"It is written from the desert
To the mountains they shall lead us
By the hand and by the heart
They will comfort you and me
In their innocence and trusting
They will teach us to be free."
~ Rhyme and Reason (regarding children), John Denver



Beloved church, hear the prophetic words from the 1st, 2nd, and 6th verses of Isaiah's 11th chapter, regarding "*The Peaceful Kingdom*": "A shoot shall come out from the stump of Jesse, and a branch shall grow out of his roots. The spirit of the Lord shall rest on him, the spirit of wisdom and understanding, the spirit of counsel and might, the spirit of knowledge and reverence for the Lord. The wolf shall live with the lamb; the leopard shall lie down with the kid; the calf and the lion will feed together, and a little child shall lead them."

Whether you resonate with the words from our sacred text, or with the lyrics from Singer Songwriter, John Denver, we all recognize the truths within both of these readings about children. Once upon a time, we were all children. We were filled with awe and wonder about the mysteries of the stars above us and were equally curious to dig into the earth under our wiggling toes as we marveled at what was hidden beneath. I'm sure we all find moments to gaze upon the inky velvet skies of night from time to time...but the "awe and wonder" that may have once overtaken us as children, is now tempered with the learning of "where, why and what" we are looking at in the night skies. With learning comes knowledge, and with knowledge comes our personal inquisition of what is "fact", "theory" and "fiction". And to be sure, our learning and knowledge is influenced by the story of what is happening around us: our lived experiences...our hardships and our comforts.

Consider now with me, how as a child you once experienced the stories, sights, and sounds within the sacred walls of a church building. Were they the walls of our own church buildings or of a different worship space? How did your body move when you came towards the altar the first time and why? How did others around you respond to your presence? If you are unable to recall these particular things, are you able to recall how you felt? We may not be able to recall specifics, but more often than not, we can't as easily forget how we've felt or were made to feel.

As we grew into adulthood, and in our own unique ways, we began to imagine, stretch, and take steps towards what we envisioned the ministry of the church to become. And not just for ourselves, but for our children, our children's children, and the cloud of witnesses that will live on long after we have passed onto life eternal. Many of you sitting in the pews on Sunday mornings bore witness to the yoking together of Holy

Ghost Darmstadt and Trinity Biddleborn, and all the growing pains that went along with that era...which I'm quite certain included moments of exhilarating joy and celebration as well as periods of stubbornness, hard-fought victories, and fracturing defeats. We are nearing two years of ministry together, beloveds. I remember the conversations and dreams shared around the table when we first came together to explore the possibility of our relationship and my calling. It was the season of Lent...the season of renewal and turning. The season of remembering that it was from the dust we were created and to the dust we shall all one-day return. Dust that's been created with the same carbon building blocks which can also be found in the origins of the stars and planets that sparkle above us. I find it quite timely that we once again find ourselves together at the threshold of the "new thing" that you had collectively voiced during our first meeting.

The ministry and outreach we live into each day pours forth from one collective body. We worship as one body. We grieve, mourn losses and tragedies as one body. We uplift each other as one body. We love, care and support each other as one body. It is by listening and discerning the guidance of the Holy Spirit that we forge our congregational path into the unknown beyond ourselves. It is through our love and commitment to one another, and our desire to ensure the longevity of this Beloved Community, that we now step boldly together into a new way of being in the world.

The Apostle Paul, long ago, penned a letter to the beloved church of Galatia. In that letter he envisioned a new way of being in the world that was essential to the proliferation of our Christian faith. Many of us know the words from his letter by heart, "There is no longer Jew or Greek; there is no longer slave or free; there is no longer male and female, for all of you are one in Christ Jesus." (Galatians 3:28) And now, I humbly and prayerfully come to each of you with a similar message. A message that echoes the words of Paul and it's just as transformational for our congregations now in 2024 as it was for the Galatians almost 2000 years ago. "There will no longer be division within our congregations; there will no longer be their church and our church; there will no longer be Holy Ghost Darmstadt or Trinity Biddleborn, for the two are one in Christ Jesus."

It is through the wisdom of the youth in confirmation, alongside my Spirit guided discernment, that the decision was made that this Confirmation Class be received into dual membership upon their Confirmation. So, the question and conversation that began to unfold from that decision was, "How do we faithfully affirm and support this new way of receiving not only our confirmands, but also any potential new members that seek to formally join our beloved congregation?" On Easter Sunday, March 31st, 2024, we will celebrate more than "just" the resurrection of our Lord and Savior. With the rekindled awe and wonder from the earliest beginnings of our faith journey, we will formally enfold ourselves into a new covenantal relationship by granting dual standing and membership within both of these long-ago yoked families of faith. During worship, an invitation will be extended for all those who wish to be a part of this visioning that

was spoken into being by your church leadership the night of my interview in 2022, and was voted into practice at the January 2024 Joint Council meeting. After this historical moment during worship, we will then welcome and formally enfold our newly joining members into the membership of Holy Ghost and Trinity United Churches of Christ; living out the words of Jesus as written in John's Gospel from the 17th chapter (v.20-23), "I ask not only on behalf of these but also on behalf of those who believe in me through their word, that they may all be one. As you, Father, are in me and I am in you, may they also be in us, so that the world may believe that you have sent me. The glory that you have given me I have given them, so that they may be one, as we are one, I in them and you in me, that they may become completely one, so that the world may know that you have sent me and have loved them even as you have loved me." Jesus' words of prayer from John's gospel illustrate God's will for us as members within the Body of Christ. These too were the words that formed the motto of our denomination, "That they may all be one", as the United Church of Christ was birthed into on that historic Tuesday, June 25th, 1957. From these youthful years as a denomination, the saints who came before us (and many who still stand alongside us), experienced and approached this "new thing" with reservations and uneasiness. And yet, all of the Evangelical and Reformed churches, responding to a responsibility laid upon them by their church tradition, moved a step closer toward reunion of the Christian church; as with faith in God and growing trust in one another.

Your elected church leaders shall continue in conversation throughout the year around the delineation of our constitutions, by-laws, and financial profiles moving forward. It was and is with great faith, trust and deep discernment that you called upon these members to step into service and leadership to ensure the well-being of our faith family and our church buildings. There will also be opportunities for greater discussion during our singular Annual Meeting on February 25th. Until then, beloveds in Christ, "May God bless you and keep you. May God's face shine upon you. May God's countenance be lifted upon you and give you peace." Amen, and amen.



On February 28th, immediately following Sunday worship at Darmstadt, we will gather in the hall and meet together as the beloved community of Holy Ghost and Trinity United Churches of Christ.

During our Annual Meeting, we will touch upon our continued efforts towards revitalization and through the introduction and approval of new programming which will include: Pastor Tarrah's vision for a new way of educating through Confirmation; new opportunities for educating our children and youth within and outside of Sunday morning worship. We will approve budgets that ensure the proper maintenance, continuity, and care for both of our church building locations. 
New Members
